This collection contains monographs relating directly to U.S. Army installations and munitions.

The collection is divided into three categories: General Works, Installations, and Munitions. "General Works" consists of monographs dealing with the organizational history of the Arsenal system, alphabetized by title. "Installations" contains monographs dealing with specific Army installations, alphabetized by installation. "Munitions" is made up of monographs covering specific munitions, alphabetized by title.

**Detailed Description of the Collection**

**2006.10.1 – Activities in the Ordnance Districts, 1946-1953 (1955)**

A report surveying the roles and activities of the ordnance districts.

**2006.10.2 – The AMC Arsenals (2 volumes) (1972)**

A report oriented toward what can be done to achieve and maintain a viable and responsive “Arsenal System.”

**2006.10.3 – Army Materiel Command: Arsenal for the Brave (1970)**

Describes the consolidated functions of AMC, in terms of the command’s origin, organization, facilities, and functions.

**2006.10.4 – Freedom’s Arsenal: A Strategy for Managing the Army’s Arsenals and Ammunition Plants (2002)**

This report documents the results of an analysis of the Army’s ordnance industrial base. It focuses on arsenals and ammunition plants.

**2006.10.5 – Ordnance Arsenals (Missions, Utilization, Management) (1959)**

A study of ordnance arsenals, in order to determine their effectiveness in supporting the Ordnance mission.

**2006.10.6 – Tanks and Industry: The Detroit Arsenal, 1940-1954 (1995)**

A history of the Detroit Arsenal.

**2006.10.7 – In-House Armament Capability – Frankford Arsenal (1973)**

Examines the need for the government-owned government-operated production capabilities at Frankford Arsenal.

**2006.10.8 – Basic Installation History – Longhorn Army Ammunition Plant, Marshall, Texas (1968)**

A history of Longhorn AAP.

**2006.10.9 – The Redstone Arsenal Complex in its Second Decade, 1950-1960 (1969)**

A history of the Redstone Arsenal during the 1950s.

**2006.10.10 – The Redstone Arsenal Complex in the Pre-Missile Era (A History of Huntsville Arsenal, Gulf Chemical Warfare Depot, and Redstone Arsenal, 1941-1949) (1966)**

A history of Huntsville Arsenal, Gulf Chemical Warfare Depot, and Redstone Arsenal.

**2006.10.11 – Building a Base: Selfridge and the Army (1996)**

A history of family housing at Selfridge Air National Guard Base.

**2006.10.12 – Sunflower Army Ammunition Plant – Plant History, July 1971 thru December 1986 (1986)**

A history of Sunflower AAP, July 1971 thru December 1986.

**2006.10.13 – Aircraft Armament Capabilities – U.S. Army Weapons Command (1962)**

A study of aircraft armament capabilities of the U.S. Army Weapons Command, focusing on systems management, research and development, installation and test manufacturing.

**2006.10.14 – American Weapons Available for Export (1977)**

A photocopy of the original manuscript, which details which American weapons are available for export.

**2006.10.15 – Charlie One, the Last Cannon: A Wartime Experiment, 1941-1945 (n.d.)**

A history of the T92 Howitzer.

**2006.10.16 – History of the Redstone Missile Command (1965)**

The story of the Redstone Field Artillery Missile System, the first large ballistic missile system developed by the Department of the Army.

**2006.10.17 – The Media and the Political Milieu: How the Sergeant York Became the System that Everyone Loved to Hate (1992)**

Concerns the controversial Division Air Defense (DIVAD) gun, the Sergeant York, and the downfall of a program that had lasted seven years, spent \$1.8 billion dollars, and produced nothing, ultimately, except a few early production models.

**2006.10.18 – Profile on Munitions, 1950-1977 (n.d.)**

A personal recollection of Army ordnance history.

**2006.10.19 – Military Reservations (1937-1951)**

A survey of U.S. Army installations in the United States. Separated by state or territory, with descriptions and histories of each installation. Includes 39 states, the Canal Zone, District of Columbia, and Mexico. Excludes Colorado, Georgia, Hawaii, Illinois, Kansas, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, New Jersey, North Carolina, and Washington.
