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### CFC CAMPAIGN WAS A SUCCESS

Lake City exceeds goal of raising \$13,000 for Heartland Combined Federal Campaign for the Greater Kansas City area.



Dale Pollard Bridge was originally constructed in 1941. The Corps of Engineers conducted a bridge inspection on November 29, 2006. The bridge was closed shortly after inspection due to age and deterioration and not meeting the required load limits. Temporary repairs were made until such time when budget would allow the bridge to be rebuilt. Funding was approved in the amount of 1.5M in August 2011. The bridge was then closed down on September 1, 2011 to allow Burns and McDonald, and Kissick Construction to perform a design /build. It was later re-opened on November 14 after construction was complete.
