

BRIGADIER GENERAL DANIEL J. DUNCAN COMMANDER, JOINT MUNITIONS COMMAND



Brig. Gen. Daniel J. Duncan assumed the duties of Commander of the Joint Munitions Command on April 25, 2025. JMC provides the joint forces with ready, reliable, and lethal munitions at the speed of war, sustaining global readiness.

In April 1994, Duncan was commissioned as an Ordnance Officer from the Army ROTC program at Washington State University, Pullman, Washington.

Brig. Gen. Duncan has earned a Master's in Strategic Studies from the United States Army War College, Carlisle, Pennsylvania, a Master of Arts in management and leadership from Webster University, St. Louis, Missouri, and a Bachelor of Arts in political science from Washington State University.
