HISTORY:

RFAAP was initially established as two sites – a smokeless powder plant (Radford Ordnance Works) and a bag manufacturing and loading plant for artillery, cannon and mortar projectiles (New River Ordnance Works). Each site operated separately through 1945. That year, the Radford Ordnance Works was renamed Radford Arsenal and the New River Ordnance Works became a subordinate post. In 1950, New River Ordnance Works (now known as the New River Unit) became an integral part of the Radford Arsenal and remained so as the arsenal was renamed the Radford Ordnance Plant. In 1963, the plant was renamed the Radford Army Ammunition Plant. RFAAP is a Government-Owned, Contractor-Operated installation.

FACILITIES:

RFAAP is housed on more than 6,800 acres with 1,297 active facilities/buildings, 214 magazines/igloos with a storage capacity of 441,000 square feet. RFAAP houses 13 commercial tenants.
